

Bishop Young Jin Cho announced that the **2015 Annual Conference offering** goal will be \$150,000 to support three different ministries. The offering goal includes \$50,000 for continued support of our partnership with the Methodist Mission in Cambodia as they continue to purchase property for new churches; \$50,000 for United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) Global Health ministries to aid the Ebola-ravaged countries of Sierra Leone and Liberia; and \$50,000 to support mission projects working with the poor in the Danville and Eastern Shore districts.

On Wednesday, May 13, the Rev. Dave Rochford, Staunton District superintendent, began a **four-day trip paddling his kayak** down rivers on the western side of the district and beyond to save lives from malaria. He had challenged Staunton District churches to help send him down the river by sponsoring his trip. For every \$100 donated to Imagine No Malaria, Rochford agreed to paddle a mile. Churches raised more than \$13,000, saving 1,300 lives. Flooding in south and central Texas over Memorial Day weekend forced a United Methodist couple onto the roof of their home, with the husband losing his grasp and the wife holding on and singing hymns for several hours. Larry Thomas, a 74-year-old member of Wimberley United Methodist Church, was swept away and died in the floods that engulfed houses along the Blanco River in Wimberley, Tex. His wife, Carol Thomas, survived with scratches and bruises. Elsewhere in south Texas, United Methodist relief efforts began and the Texas Annual Conference carried on with its annual gathering in Houston, despite flooding there.

The conference Board of Church and Society is partnering with American Jews for a Just Peace/Jewish Voice for Peace Boston's Health and Human Rights Project to co-sponsor an Interfaith Peace-BUILDER (IFPB) delegation to **Israel/Palestine Nov. 2-15**. This delegation will participate in the Palestinian olive harvest season — generally a time of great community activism, when people of all ages from Palestine, Israeli peace and justice groups and international groups join farmers as they reap their harvest. Participants will hear from Palestinian farmers and learn of the importance of agriculture to the Palestinian economy and culture. They will also meet Israelis and Palestinians working for peace and justice and Israeli settlers who have a different perspective. While the purpose of the delegation is to learn from Israeli and Palestinian peacemakers, the group will also visit some of the traditional religious sites. Cost will be around \$2500, which includes 13 days of hotel and home-stay accommodations, breakfasts, dinners, local transportation, guides, speaker/event fees, basic tips and gratuities.
