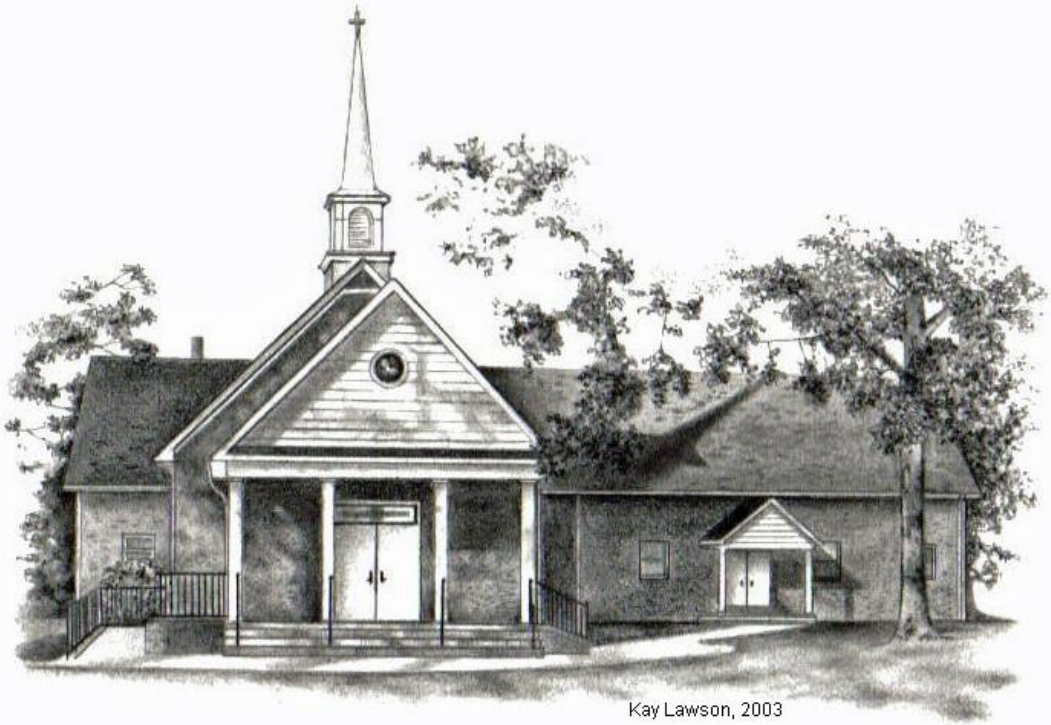

To all you dads out there: While you're relaxing in your recliner and watching sports on June 21, and your kids are on their best behavior to honor **Father's Day**, don't forget to thank a United Methodist. In 1909 in Spokane, Wash., Sonora Smart Dodd listened to a Mother's Day sermon at Central Methodist Episcopal Church. Dodd's own mother had died 11 years earlier, and her father had raised their six children alone. Dodd felt moved to honor her father, and fathers everywhere, with a special day as well. She proposed her idea to local religious leaders, and gained wide acceptance. June 19, 1910, was designated as the first Father's Day, and sermons honoring fathers were presented throughout the city. When newspapers across the country carried the story about Spokane's observance, the popularity of Father's Day spread. Several presidents declared it a holiday, and in 1972, Richard Nixon established it as the third Sunday in June.

As of June 1, **Virginia Conference United Methodists have raised \$655,263.98 and saved more than 65,526 lives for Imagine No Malaria.** Churches are urged to send in all Imagine No Malaria donations to the conference treasurer as soon as possible.

The July issue **of the Virginia United Methodist Advocate** contains the complete list of clergy appointments for 2015-16 and will be distributed to all members of Annual Conference during the Sunday morning worship service that "fixes" the appointments. Also highlighted are local churches that paid 100% and above of their 2014 conference and district apportionments and those churches that had a 10% increase in payment of apportionments from the prior year. In addition, this issue of the Advocate focuses on Discipleship Circles, small group opportunities designed to help leaders throughout the Virginia Conference support each other spiritually, collaborate with each other for increased fruitfulness, and hold each other accountable for constant improvement. In this ministry, he has developed an evangelism and discipleship pathway to establish campus, young adults and family ministries. He has launched an E-group (evangelistic small group) initiative and built a youth leadership team to transition to a model targeting families. He also leads a mid-week contemporary worship service. A native of Brazil, he has lived in both Brazil and the United States, and his ministry experiences span both countries.

As part of a special arrangement with the Virginia Conference, **Kings Dominion amusement park is offering United Methodists discounted prices on tickets during United Methodist Days at the park**. *Cost is \$34 per person for ages 3 and older for discount tickets valid June 25-29, July 1-6, and July 18-20.* Children ages 2 and under will be admitted free. During the discount days, two Christian music events will be held on the park grounds. KingsFest (three full days of Christian music featuring speakers and singers of praise and worship including Skillett, LeCrae, Tenth Avenue North, Jeremy Camp and more) will be June 25-27. JoyFest (one of the country's largest gospel festivals featuring Fred Hammond, Tamela and David Mann and Tye Tribbett) will be Saturday, July 18. KingsFest and JoyFest tickets are sold separately in advance through the call center at (804) 876-5000. Cost is \$40 for Good Any Day tickets, which are valid April 11-Oct. 31. The Virginia Conference will receive \$1 for each ticket purchased online during United Methodist Days.

The conference Communications office is selling **DVDs of the 2015 Annual Conference session**. Volume 1 will include the memorial service, ordination, mission and special offering worship service and recognition of retirees. Volume 2 will include Bishop Cho's Episcopal Address, Laity Address, Common Table, Discipleship Circles and Imagine No Malaria reports, Sunday morning closing worship and teaching sessions led by the Rev. Timothy Bias. Cost is \$20 for Volume 1, \$10 for Volume 2, and \$25 for both volumes. After July 1, the price will increase to \$22 for Volume 1, \$12 for Volume 2 and \$30 for both volumes. This year, for the first time, a short overview video of the 2015 Annual Conference (suitable for use in making a report on Annual Conference to your local church) will be available to view on the conference Facebook page or YouTube channel, free of charge. Cost is \$10 for a copy of the overview video on a DVD (shipping included). In the U.S., perceptions of United Methodist values differ by a person's role and experience. What has a high degree of importance to a pastor may be of much less significance to a church member, and especially to those who don't attend regularly. **But most United Methodists agree that an emphasis on God's grace is very important**, as well as having a Communion table where all are welcome. These are some of the findings of an extensive new quantitative study by United Methodist Communications conducted in November-December 2014. The survey, conducted online among a representative sample of 400 United Methodist members, and phone surveys of 850 pastors and leaders, finds that opinions about what it means to be United Methodist are as diverse as people's reasons for being a part of the church. More than 39% of member respondents are United Methodists because they were born into United Methodist families. Beyond that, the reasons respondents gave as to why they became a member of The United Methodist Church were varied. Beliefs and teachings were the second most frequently mentioned reason for affiliation (17%), followed by liking the people, liking the pastor, or marrying into a United Methodist family (all 8%). Some like the church's emphasis on social issues (4%), while 2% find a convenient location to be the prevailing factor.

The **Five-Day Academy for Spiritual Formation will be Oct. 4-9** at the Roslyn Retreat Center, Richmond. This program of Upper Room Ministries will provide an opportunity for clergy and laity to deepen their relationship with God through a daily rhythm of prayer, worship, learning and reflection. Each day will include teaching by Dr. Robert Mulholland and Dr. Roberta Bondi. It will also include periods of silence, morning and evening prayer, Eucharist, covenant groups and community time. Focus of this academy is Sacred Journey: Shaped by the Spirit. A \$100 non-refundable registration fee is required to reserve your academy space by July 25. This amount will be applied to your total cost. Early registration is recommended as space is limited
